The benefits of Lifetime members include:


- No annual dues

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Annual Banquet

TIMELINE:

June 1st

- Location of Banquet
- Time and All Costs
 - Include PA system, DVD player and TV as appropriate
- Menu
- Email the entire Board
- Approval from 4 or more Board members to proceed

July 1st

- Verify there are adequate number of larger medals for solo swimmers
- Verify there are adequate numbers of mid-size medals for relay swimmers.
- Note: Each member of the Relay received a medal

August 1st

- Determine gift for Kayakers*
- Email the entire Board with costs and specifics
- Approval from 4 or more Board members

September 1st

- Alert CCSF Newsletter Banquet location, costs and RSVP details.
- Determine if logo items will be available for sale or order Cafe' Press examples to eliminate collecting and paying sales tax.

October 1st

- Get a complete list of participating Observers from Support
- Get a complete list of participating Kayaker/Paddlers from Support
- Get a complete list of completed Solo Swims with times from Support
- Get a complete list of completed Relays with times from Support
- Verify Names are spelled correctly

October 15 - Print Certificates

- For successful Solo Swims
- For successful Relay Swims
- For new Lifetime Memberships

October 15 - Contact Banquet Presenters

- Confirm availability of speakers
- Print a Program Guide for those Board members / or others participating.

- Award to Solos by: Vice President & Treasurer

- Be prepared with RSVP list of names

- If pre-arranged get the DVD of swim events to be played at the banquet
- Memorabilia and promotional gifts
- *******SALES TAX REQUIREMENTS
 - If gifts are sold at the banquet, be sure to keep accurate records for the State Board of Equalization and be prepared to pay appropriate sales tax to the State of California
 - Or bring samples of Café Press items so individuals can purchase gifts online eliminating the need for CCSF to collect and pay sales tax.



Catalina Channel Swimming History

On January 15, 1927 George Young won the Wrigley Ocean Marathon swim across the Catalina Channel in 15 hours, 44 minutes, and 30 seconds. Within three months of the Wrigley Ocean Marathon Race, another 4 swimmers successfully conquered the Catalina Channel.

Between 1927 and 1952 only two men swam the Channel, and in the mid-50's nearly a dozen swimmers crossed the Channel. Numerous attempts were made in the 1960's



established the modern era of the Catalina Channel. The

men's and women's speed records were rewritten. Each decade has seen more successful crossings: 29 in the 70s, 32 in the 80s, 33 in the 90s, and 95 successful Catalina Channel swims in the first decade of the 21st century.
