

Cindy Cleveland Honored by IMSHoF

Double-crossing of Catalina Channel occurred 40 years ago this month.

The International Marathon Swimming Hall of Fame just announced their 2018 honorees. Several have swum the Catalina Channel, but none is so closely associated with the CCSF as **Cindy Cleveland**. This month marks the 40th anniversary of her two-way crossing of Catalina. In 1978 she completed a two-way crossing of the Anacapa Passage. The next year, Cindy became the first to circumnavigate Catalina Island (48 miles) and the following year she was the first to swim Monterey Bay (24 miles) in central California. It would be more than three decades before these swims were duplicated.

Congratulations to trailblazer Cindy Cleveland and IMSHoF Honor Swimmer. IMSHoF 2018 members who've crossed Catalina include Jaimie Monahan, Rohan Dattatrey More (India), Anna-Carin Nordin (Sweden) and Sarah Thomas.

A celebration for the 2018 honorees will take place Saturday, March 31, 2018 in London.
