CPR certification is required of every CCSF official observer, who may <u>renew</u> their CPR/AED certification at these sessions completely free of charge.


ESCORT OPEN WATER SWIMMERS CLINIC

The support crew is essential to the success of any open water swim. This FREE course, taught by **David Clark**, will help you develop your skills as a kayaker and support crew member. It will also help you improve your own swims by developing the teamwork between the swimmer and support crew that makes successful swims possible.

Topics will include planning, equipment, safety, boat handling, navigation, communication, feeding, and race strategy. The course will meet on the beach in the morning and after a break we'll practice skills on the water in the afternoon.

Congratulations to **Steve Stievenart** of France, who is the first swimmer in nearly 100 years to <u>complete the Catalina</u> <u>Channel</u> in the month of February. The only other person, **Myrtle Huddleston**, became <u>the first woman to</u> <u>swim the Catalina Channel</u>. She made her historical crossing the first week of February 1927.

GREEN SEA TURTLES -- Population Rises

The Eastern Pacific green sea turtles that nest in Mexico have been showing up in the shallow waters of Southern California, including the Catalina Channel. A research paper from last year reported a "substantial population recovery." **Justin Greenman** of the <u>National Oceanographic</u> and Atmospheric Administration Fisheries told the <u>Los Angeles</u> <u>Times</u> that the once rare sightings of green sea turtles have become more common along Southern California beaches.
